You don't get a special pass by just filling up a form. You can only get approval for your application if you can present clear holiday plans. What this means is that, you need to make sure that all your activities are mainly for holiday purposes. Looking for work should take a backseat.

After your plans are given the go signal, you have to make the personal promise to follow them once you enter Japan.
